

I've been using the Overstreet Guide for years, and for the last 3 I've been using it to value my books for insurance purposes. I've noticed a ton of missing titles and issues. None of these will break the bank, but I feel they need to be listed. Also, this year, more than others, I have found a TON of errors. Since my attempts to contact them about this were met with an oh well attitude (and at one point I was told to use comic collector live, which I despise), I'm going to publicly list the omissions and errors I have found. Let Overstreet know!

I have been getting this price guides which updates comics on a yearly basis to let the collector know what his/her collection is worth financially. The parts I use the most are the price updates and

the grading standards. Big is infused with so much information, ads from buyers, ads for restoration and grading, trends in comics and jam-packed with essential information every collector should have need of. This guide is for serious collectors, not for those that just want to buy a comic or book to read. For someone like that, it would be a waste of money, but to an investor, it is like having gold in your home.

The expanded Victorian and Platinum Age listings are excellent, check them out.... you may not have millions for Action #1 but you can pick up a copy of the first comic printed in the English language (1841) for a few hundred bucks.....it's listed in the Victorian section.
