

Today there is a growing new enthusiasm for ranch houses and the midcentury furnishings that go with them. *Atomic Ranch* illustrates in stunning color photography the virtues of the ranch house, often decried as "cookie cutter," and shows why these homes worked so well for their first residents and still function beautifully today. Their first book, *Atomic Ranch: Design Ideas for Stylish Ranch Homes*, was published by Gibbs Smith in 2006. They live in Portland, Oregon, in a 1952 brick ranch. Michelle Gringeri-Brown and Jim Brown publish *Atomic Ranch* magazine, a quarterly devoted to mid-century homes. Gringeri-Brown was the editor of *American Bungalow* magazine for nine years, and her freelance work has been published in *Westways*, the *Los Angeles Times*, *Photographers' Forum*, and *Sunset* magazine's *View*. Jim Brown is an editorial photographer with degrees in photography and English literature. His photo-graphy has been published numerous times in *Motor Trend*, *Sunset*, *Motorcyclist*, *American Bungalow*, *Westways*, *Car & Driver*, and *Hot Rod*. They both grew up in postwar ranch houses and strongly support the preservation of this overlooked architectural style.

I have owned this book for several years now and keep it on display in my living room. I love flipping through it and find it very inspirational. I even modeled my kitchen after one in the book. I loved it so much I subscribed to the magazine for a while and bought the second book when it was released. This is one of my all time favorite books and I highly recommend it to all midcentury modern lovers.

Page layouts and pictures are very low quality in the Kindle version. Don't buy kindle version. Buy the actual book.

This book has a lot of great examples of mid-century modern ranch houses, but I felt like there weren't enough pictures of each one-- often the text refers to design elements that aren't visible in any of the pictures included, and you turn the page hoping to find a picture of what they're referring to, but the next page is about a different house. It's a good book, but I was more impressed with their other book, *Atomic Ranch Midcentury Interiors*, and would recommend it over this one.

I love this book! The author's magazine (of the same name) is awesome and this book covers homes from the early issues which are no longer available (issues, not homes). I love seeing the beautiful interiors and exteriors of modest size homes which most people consider beneath their notice because they aren't historically "old enough" or architecturally significant. I have learned a lot about mid-century modern homes from reading this book. The photos are great and the book is very informative. If you live in a plain ranch home, and enjoy a streamlined style of living, then I highly suggest you get this book. It is full of practical tips and resources.

This is a great book that finally gives America's "average" midcentury tract houses their due. The photos are beautiful and the information is great. Eichler, Levittown, Westlake, and other midcentury

neighborhoods are pictured along with detailed information on remodeling, restoring, and preserving these underappreciated little gems of modernism. It's a nice coffee-table presentation of the subject that is pleasing to just flip through for the sake of the photos, but also informative enough to spend some real time with.
