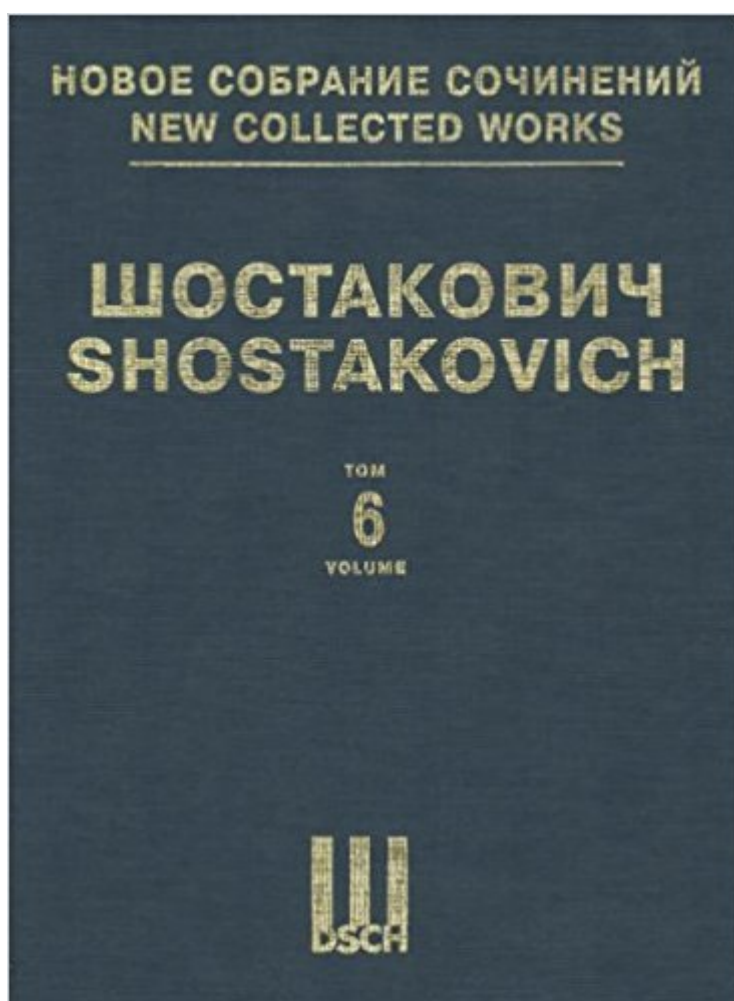

## Customer Reviews

Beautiful edition, easily-legible fonts, quality paper and binding, lucid commentaries in both Russian and English (with a good, professional-quality translation in the case of the latter). The ONLY quibble I have - and it's negligible in addition to actually having a reason (trumpets are higher-pitched than French-horns) is Shostakovich's putting the Trumpets ABOVE the Horns in his score-layout, apparently a habit he developed after the 5th Symphony and his opera "Lady Macbeth of Mchensk District". Traditionally, Horns are placed above instead of below the Trumpets, especially as the Trumpets and Trombones really are one family of brass, with the Horns and Wagner-Tubas (played by the Hornists) being the other. [The regular Bass/Contrabass Tuba, although meant to be the bass-voice to either family, is usually placed with the Trumpet-family as the bass to the latter.] Nevertheless, this IS a top-notch edition which absolutely deserves the highest possible rating - warmly recommended!!!
