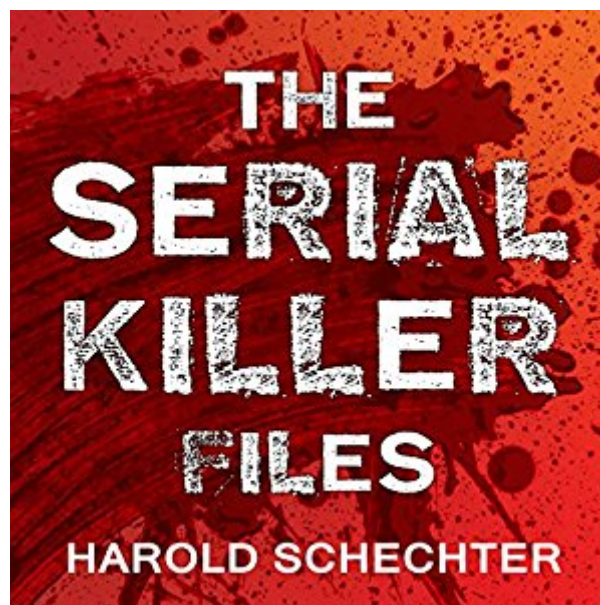




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The Serial Killer Files: The Who, What, Where, How, And Why Of The World's Most Terrifying Murderers

For a person interested in the psychology and facts surrounding serial killers through history this is a must read. Harold Schechter has the ability to convey the facts and details of a case without over inflating or dramatizing them but at the same time without sounding completely scientific and inhuman. I spent hours back checking facts and reading further on the fates of killers and victims in many of the cases he references, for which there are many (I want to say hundreds but I'm not

completely sure that's true). I found the evolution of the public understanding of serial killers to be fascinating. Schechter does not follow a chronology but rather tackles key elements and common themes behind serial killers and then uses examples found across centuries to bring to light the key details behind the psychology or behaviour patterns of said themes. Very well done.

Oh yes, I am a lady with raunchy humour, and a deviant curiosity into the morbid. It is fascinating and educational. I didn't purchase this for me, but my 4th son, who is as warped as I, was so enamored with it, I thought I would take a peek... read the whole thing in two days. Now, I have a Masters in Forensics, and I learned a couple things from this book. Well written, easily to comprehend (if your not simple), and graphic enough to hold your attention. In fact, this book states that is on the contrary and that some of them were of average intelligence. If you enjoy reading these types of books, this is a must read. However, I will warn you, there are some stories they tell about some of the serial killers that may be disturbing. I have read some books that have pretty disturbing stories and even they did not compare to some of the stories in this book. The only reason for just four stars is it is quite repetitive. Many killers are referenced numerous times and each time the same short description follows. Its almost like every chapter was written separately for something else then just compiled in this book. But it doesn't ruin the book by any means. I would still highly recommend it along with any and all of his other books.

This book is not for the squeamish. I enjoy the horror genres as well as learning about the

psychology behind why people do some of the things they do, and this book does not disappoint. The author delves more into the reasons why these sociopaths do what they do which I found very interesting and enlightening. It is an educated, well-written look at the subject. There are some details that may make people cringe, but overall it does a nice job of delivering the material. One other point that I really liked were all the links and suggestions for further reading throughout the book. For those wanting more, the author does provide numerous avenues.

Though disturbing, this book was highly graphic and had a lot of information about these serial killers I almost wish I never knew. To anyone interested in reading this, first ask yourself, do I have a weak stomach? If the answer is maybe - I don't recommend you read it. There were several of the killers I barely made it through just knowing that it was a real person. The book itself was very interesting and well-written, it's the content you need to prepare yourself for.

It's a reference book but reads well cover-to-cover, or you can just look up the specific topics you're interested in. But you'll end up reading the whole thing. Covers all the basics (Gacy, Bundy, Dahmer. . . . and the difference between serial killers and mass murderers) plus a hundred other things I'd never heard of (African American serial killers, or weirdest ways of dumping the bodies). . . . also has a whole comic book about a serial killer named Panzram.

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
