I've enjoyed a few of this author's earlier works (Rylee Adamson) so one of the things I can immediately say is that I truly enjoyed how different Alena was from Rylee. She was raised by a religious community, and taught - well, really, everything that women today are fighting so hard to make a 'norm'. As the second installment to the Venom trilogy, we see that she still struggles with the fact that she's now a monster and no longer a human, or existing, for that matter. Because according to the law, she died in that joke of a hospital, and doesn't have any rights to her inheritance or her bakery, the one thing in the world she practically cares about. This book took more to Super Duper *snorts* Rights and Alena learning to step up and stand up for it, whether or not she really means to do it for the supernaturals in general. I liked this better than the first one because she's got a better hold on her life, even if there's more chaos. Still couldn't take her seriously whenever she brought up the fact that she was still technically married, but that's a personal thing since I have my own views on marriage, and if anything, it forced me to see from her perspective, which was an experience in itself. Otherwise, I liked how much she struggled with herself. A lot of character growth there, with the constant battle of Old Her and New Boss Baddie. A few twists were in here that totally blew me away, and oh my God, but I think I saw something from the author's other series. And it really makes me want to continue them and demand the third book for this

So this book continues Alena's story. She is still trying to find her way in her new life as a monster, a Super Duper, get recognized by the government so she can divorce her husband and oh yeah, there's a new Hero trying to kill her. Now this isn't going to be your typical review. See most reviews tell you about the story and how great it is, I'm going to tell you about something else I see.

Shannon Mayer uses Greek gods and goddesses, monsters and supernaturals to discuss real life issues! In this fictional story she brings to life prejudice and shows from the supernatural community's viewpoint what it's like to not be considered a real person. To not have the same rights as the person standing next to you just because you may look different. There was even a reference to mixed relationships with the whole talk about how supernaturals don't date cross race. She also brings up how hard it can be for a beautiful woman to be taken seriously and how everything a beautiful woman such as Alena does is viewed by other women as man stealing even when nothing at all is happening. She shows how the media can make things change when legal papers sometimes don't. But most of all she shows that all families have issues no matter if human, gods/goddesses, Super Duper or otherwise, lol. I think Shannon Mayer is bringing so really big issues to light and some old ones forward in a way that makes it hard to put the book down. I know I thought about slavery and biracial couples. I thought about women's rights, gay rights and all the freedoms we have in America. What a great way to make people think. I commend Ms. Mayer on a beautifully written book with a great story line. The ending line gave me goosebumps!! I can't wait for the next one and I don't want it to be the last we hear of Alena!!!

Book two of this series takes the reader on several wild rides literally, while good girl Alena Budrene, deceased from designer virus sweeping the world, reborn due to supernatural DNA is just trying to catch a break in divorce court, proving she does indeed exist. And to keep slimy cheating poophead husband Roger from selling both her family home, and her bakery Vanilla and Honey (that to her worst rival!)
